Rev. Dr. Robert M. Franklin, Jr. is director of the Department of Religion at the Chautauqua Institution in Chautauqua, N.Y. He also serves as senior advisor for community and diversity at Emory University and is the James T. and Berta R. Laney Chair in Moral Leadership within the university's Candler School of Theology. Franklin is president emeritus of Morehouse College where he served as the tenth president.

Franklin formerly was the Presidential Distinguished Professor of Social Ethics at Emory University where he provided leadership for a university-wide initiative titled "Confronting the Human Condition and the Human Experience."

Franklin provides commentary for the NPR program "All Things Considered" and weekly commentary for Atlanta Interfaith Broadcasting Television. He has served as a program officer at the Ford Foundation, and as an adviser to the foundation's president on future funding for religion and public life initiatives. He has also served as a consultant for the Annie E. Casey Foundation's work on alleviating poverty and strengthening fragile families.
